First Sunday of Advent (C) 01ST December 2024 Season of Advent - 'A Fresh Start'

This year Advent begins, very neatly, on 01st December. The Gospel for the Sundays of Advent – this year from the Gospel of Luke – build the sense of anticipation over the course of the month. In dramatic fashion, the opening Gospel of this issue & season kicks off not with the birth of Christ but with Christ's words about the Second Coming.

Here it is in the new translation we in Britain are now using at Mass: At that time: Jesus said to his disciples: "There will be signs in sun & moon & stars; & on the earth distress of nations in perplexity because of the roaring of the sea & the waves, people fainting with fear & with foreboding of what is coming on the world. For the powers of the heavens will be shaken. And then they will see

the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power & great glory..."



The second Sunday moves from the apocalyptic vision to Saint John the Baptist as precursor of Christ's mission. As it is written in the book of the words of Isaiah the prophet, "The voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley shall be filled, & every mountain & hill shall be made low, & the crooked shall become straight, & the rough

places shall become level ways, & all flesh shall see the salvation of God."

The Third Sunday continues this theme. As the people were filled with expectation, & all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Christ, John answered them all, saying, "I baptise you with water, but he who is mightier than I is coming, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit & fire... "The fourth Sunday of Advent moves back in time to the moment when the Baptist's own mother prophesied the coming of the Saviour as he lay in her womb. "Blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfilment of what was spoken to her from the Lord."

A Time of Vigilance and Transformation: Advent with Pope Francis

As we begin the season of Advent, Pope Francis reminds us of its profound call to vigilance—not as an anxious waiting, but as a hopeful anticipation of Christ's coming. In his recent Angelus reflections, the Holy Father emphasizes the need to "keep watch" with open hearts, cultivating love and readiness for God's presence in our lives.

This Advent, the Pope encourages us to embrace silence and simplicity. By creating space in our hearts and lives, we allow room for spiritual growth and for rediscovering the transformative power of God's mercy.
